#### **STUDENT INVITED TO CELEBRATE ST JOHN'S DAY**

Jack Broderick (Year 10) has been a volunteer for St John's Ambulance since he was 5, firstly as a 'badger' and then as a cadet from the age of 10. In the past year he has completed over 200 hours of first aid cover at local events such as local fetes and charity fundraising events and at national events such as the Liverpool Rock 'n' Roll Marathon and The Great Manchester Run. This has been recognised as the highest amount of duty hours in Merseyside.
